1 Call to Order

Mr. Todd called the meeting to order at 6:32pm.

2 Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Tillman led the pledge of allegiance.

3 Comments from SB, TM, and Citizens on Topics Not on the Agenda

Mr. Todd reminded everyone about Annual Green-up day on May 6, 2023. Green-up bags are available at the Town Office. Email <u>steve@vermonthill.net</u> for more information.

The Highway Superintendent spoke about road closures on Little Ascutney Road due to flooding between VT Route 106 and Lottery Lane.

- 5 Melanie Sheehan: Overdose Awareness

Melanie Sheehan gave a presentation on substance use and reducing stigma. She discussed strategies for the town to have Narcan distribution cite in town, harm reduction kits, and for the police to utilize OD Max, which logs locations on overdoses and the days they are happening so an action plan to support that area can be implemented. She left lawn sign, pamphlets, and other additional resources with the Town Manager.

The Select Board discussed barriers to sobriety, drawing the line between helping verses enabling, how location plays a role, strategies and programs that seem helpful such as prevention initiatives, the impact of mental health, progress on current legislation, and EMS burnout. The Select Board concluded that they support efforts that aim to solve the drug crisis in Vermont.

6 Unassigned Drug and Tobacco Paraphernalia Establishments

The Select Board reviewed documents regarding the Weathersfield Select Board Amendment to the Weathersfield Zoning Bylaw Drug and Tobacco Paraphernalia Establishments and how the Select Board at the time did not have the necessary signatures. Section 7.24 states that: "The foregoing amendments shall be effective 21 days after adoption, that is, on March 9, 2016. Dated at Weathersfield, Windsor County, Vermont this 16th day of February, 2016."

Mr. Fuller pointed out that this was a done deal, effective 21 days after the date it was signed and that a warning to sign it could be done as a correction matter. The Select Board agreed that they didn't want to sign off for the previous Select Board. The Select Board discussed how the state and federal laws regarding some of the items in the Bylaws have changed or not changed since the Bylaw was written and discussed issues surrounding establishments that were not grandfathered in and their proximity to the school. The Select Board agreed that the Planning Commission needs to review the Bylaw.

7. Town Manager Update

a) Roofing Projects

The Town Garage roofing project is scheduled to take place during the week of the 15th of May unless the weather does not cooperate, and in this case, the project will begin during the week of the 22nd of May. Following completion of this project, the West Weathersfield Fire Department roof will be scheduled.

b) Generator Projects

The Martin Memorial Hall Generator project is moving forward on May 31st. The Town has coordinated with Irving and are awaiting an estimate for that part of the work. The Town has a site visit scheduled at the Town Garage and 1879 Schoolhouse on May 9th with Brookfield Service. The Town is anticipating receiving an estimate to install generators at these buildings prior to the 2nd Select Board meeting in May.

c) **Overhead Doors** – Ascutney Fire Department

A claim was submitted for the overhead doors at the Ascutney Fire Department. This was an expense that was made, and one of the reasons the budget is over expended. A claim was submitted to VLCT and VLCT approved the claim. The doors cost \$4,600 to replace, with a \$1,000 deductible. VLCT sent the Town a check for \$3,600.

d) West Weathersfield Fire Department Banquet

The Town Manager attended the West Weathersfield Fire Department Banquet to thank first responders for their service. Several firefighters were recognized for their years of service, including Travis Comp, Jordyn Bagalio, and Dave Picknell for 5 years of service, Ben Waters and Tracy Dauphin for 10 years of service, Mike Wiltshire and Mychael Spaulding for 15 years of service, Josh Dauphin for 20 years of service, and Ray Stapleton for 25 years of service. The Firefighter of the year award went to Dave Picknell. This award is chosen by the group and reflects the mission statement and core values. The department also recognized Ray Stapleton for his time as Chief and leadership in other roles.

e) ARPA Update

The ARPA meeting took place on Wednesday, April 26, 2023, at 6:30pm. The meeting was held at the 1879 Schoolhouse. The Town Manager will be holding another public input meeting in mid-May and will be advertising this again. Any resident in Town that wishes to share an idea on how to best use the remaining funds is welcomed.

The Town Manager will submit a recommendation based on the community input received at the first Select Board meeting in June, and that recommendation will not only include the expenditures for ARPA funds, but also a system to match these funds with state grant programs.

The Select Board inquired about what the public input was thus far and the Town Manger brief the Select Board on those ideas: The Hoisington Field Master Plan and Engineering, a generator for the highway department, a generator for the 1879 schoolhouse, the posts at the Veterans Memorial Park, Martin Memorial Hall drainage, trails, tree maintenance, mapping scenic views, digitalization of Town Clerk's Office, office restructure and contingency.

The Select Board discussed the generators, the cost of generators verses the electricity needs associated with each building, the need of a

study to assess these needs, and the Town emergency management services.

8. Town Highway #95

There is a Town highway on private property. It is on some maps but not others but it is in the states system as a class 4 impassable road. See email from the Highway Superintendent regarding the issue:

April 26, 2023

To: Brandon Gulick

I have researched TH #95 as per your request for information.

Currently TH #95 is listed as a class 4 town highway .25 miles in length on the 2019 highway milage map. It is also marked with a U on the map to represent it is impassable/ or untraveled according to the map key.

I have done a site visit and found the road to be unidentifiable from the surrounding fields. I have found no trace of a possible road other than a gap in a stone wall that may represent a lane.

This road starts at its intersection with Cooks Pond Road and proceeds east for .25 miles over parcel span # 705-224-10852 (Keniston). It doesn't connect to a neighboring parcel or appear to be a right of way to any other parcel. The road in its entirety is on the Keniston parcel.

Currently this property is a working farm, and the location of the road is agricultural fields. Mr Keniston has stated that map companies have tried to send vehicles onto his property to get to Divoll Pasture Road. Also, according to Mr Keniston, this road is not mentioned in the deed to his property.

As a class 4 highway per act 64 I am required to inspect it annually. I am also required to repair any erosion if present (in this case no road is present).

To resolve the above-mentioned issues, I recommend the select board discontinue Town Highway #95 as per Vermont Statues Tittle 19 Chapter 7.

This will resolve the issues that Mr. Keniston has with a Town Highway passing onto his property. At the same time also relieves the Town of Weathersfield from the cost of its maintence if needed in the future.

The Select Board concluded that information for the hearing process and other legalities should be collected and ready to discuss for the next Select Board meeting.

9. Martin Memorial Hall Roofing Project

The Martin Memorial Hall roofing project has been completed. There were 2 changes as the project progressed. Premium shingles were not available & 6 pieces of plywood required replacement. The inspector agreed with both the decision to change from premium shingles to pro shingles and agreed that the 6 pieces of plywood required replacement. The cost of Pro Shingles was \$3,000 less than the cost of Premium Shingles. The total cost of plywood replacement was \$450. The net difference is \$2,550.

Motion: To reallocate the \$2,550 left over from the Martin Memorial Hallroofing project back into ARPA funds.Made by: Mr. TillmanSecond: Ms. SmithVote: All in Favor.

10. Town Reappraisal Draft RFP

The Town of Weathersfield is requesting a proposal from qualified, certified reappraisal contactors to work with Weathersfield to complete a town-wide reappraisal for the 2025 Grand List. The most recent town wide reappraisal was done in 2008. The selected contractor will be responsible for a thorough analysis of local real estate market conditions and review of the existing Computer Assisted Mass Appraisal (CAMA) data leading to the development of computer models for estimating the fair market value of all taxable property in Weathersfield.

This RFP is considered advertised on May 2, 2023. Sealed proposals must be received at the Weathersfield Town Office located at 5259 US Route 5, Ascutney, VT 05030 by 11am prevailing time, June 2, 2023. Sealed bids delivered by person, overnight express, currier, or parcel post must be clearly marked "Town of Weathersfield Reappraisal Proposal." Any bids received after this date will not be accepted, even if the proposal is postmarked on the bid due date. Copies of this Request for Proposal may be obtained by calling the Weathersfield Town Office at (802) 674-2626 Ext 2, or by email at weathersfield@weathersfield.org.

This request for proposal is intended to be explanatory, but should any discrepancy appear, or any misunderstanding arise as to the intent of anything contained herewith, the interpretation and decision of the Town of Weathersfield shall be final and binding. Any corrections of errors or omissions in the request for proposal may be made by the Town of Weathersfield when such a correction is necessary for the proper fulfillment of their intention as construed by the Town of Weathersfield.

The Select Board discussed how Town Reappraisals have been done historically and what other towns may be doing for the process. The Select

Board agreed that an RFP should be done to ensure there is enough funding for a reappraisal.

11. Tax Collector Report

On April 17, 2023, the Select Board requested that the Town provide the status of delinquent taxes & agreements. The last Town Report showed that in FY22, the Town had \$290,038.33 in delinquent taxes outstanding on the books. The Town had been working to decrease the delinquencies on the books since FY20, and it takes a couple years for it to fully clear out of reporting. As of April 27, 2023, the Town has \$33,914.49 in delinquent taxes on the FY23 books, which is an 88.3% decrease since the recent annual report that was distributed. The annual report that was distributed contained delinquent taxes between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022.

The Town Manager reported that the Town held tax sales in 2020, 2021, and 2022, and between the tax sales that were completed and the agreements that were made per policy, it takes a couple of years for everything to work out, which is why the number still showed a high number of delinquencies in the last report. For example, in 2020, the Town had 134 total delinquencies totaling over \$300K on our books. Currently, there are 31 total delinquencies totaling \$33,914.49. Of these 31 delinquencies, 8 of these have made agreements per policy, and of these 8 agreements, 3 have defaulted. Of the remaining 22 that have not made agreements, the total delinquency is \$6,120, and the average delinquency is \$266.08.

The Town will continue efforts to collect delinquent taxes by policy and law and anticipate holding a tax sale on the 3 properties that have defaulted on their agreements and sending a notice of tax sale on the remaining 22 that have not made an effort to come to an agreement with the Town per policy.

Mr. Fuller and the Town Manager discussed the budget process. Mr. Fuller stated that he would like to find out more about what happened with \$256,123.83 between April 2020 and April 2023 in regards to income as he had not seen this happen historically and had concerns about how it will all level out in the end. It was suggested that a discussion about using a cash system instead of an accrual system might be worthwhile.

RE: Excavation Bid Award

Dear Selectors,

On April 17th we advertised an RFB (Request for Bids) for excavation work on Mountain View Road (approximately 1800' of ditch line), including ditching, stone removal, and some tree removal). We recommended a 38,000lb machine that includes a ditching bucket, digging bucket, and thumb attachment. This work needs to be completed by June 30, 2023. (See attachment A – RFB). The Question period extended from April 18th to May 1st, bids were due on May 5th at 11am, and a public bid opening took place on May 5th at 11am.

See Attachment B – Bid Opening. We received 2 bids: DLX is charging \$140 per hour (See attachment C – DLX Bid), and TS Property Maintenance is charging \$130 per hour (See attachment D – TS Property Maintenance Bid).

Analysis #1 – Analyzing based on hourly rates and number of hours

TS Property Maintenance is charging \$10 less per hour, however, this company also charges a \$130 mobilization fee, whereas DLX does not. Analyzing the information based on cost per hour, number of hours, and mobilization fees, and estimating the job taking 60 hours to complete, the cost difference between TS Property Maintenance and DLX is \$600. After we subtract the \$130 mobilization fee from TS Property Maintenance, this form of analysis demonstrates a \$470 savings.

Flaws in Analysis #1

The equipment between the two companies differs. DLX has a 38,000lb machine with a 1.25 cubic yard bucket. TS Property Maintenance has a 31,000lb machine with a .78 cubic yard bucket. This is not factored into analysis #1.

Analysis #2 – Analyzing based on Hourly Rates, Bucket Size, and Estimated CY's

This analysis is based on the project requiring the movement of an estimated 5,000 cubic yards, the size of the buckets moving the material, and the cost associated with each machine per the bids we received.

When we analyze the project cost per company based on these factors, it will cost \$4,666.67 for DLX to do the project and \$7,074.44 (with mobilization fees) for TS Property Maintenance to do the project. The total estimated cost difference between TS Property Maintenance & DLX is \$2,407.78, and DLX is the low bidder in this scenario.

Flaws in Analysis #2

We're factoring in the number of cubic yards each machine is moving per hour and estimating that each machine will move 2 buckets per minute/ 120 buckets per hour. This indicates that DLX will get the job done faster with a larger bucket. The flaw in this analysis is that we assume each machine will move 2 full buckets per minute, and we do not factor in the speed of the operator or the speed of the equipment. This analysis also assumes that each bucket will be full every time, and that neither operator will overfill their bucket.

Finance

The Highway Department received a grant from Grants in Aid to do this project. The total award is \$21,780, of which \$19,800 is paid through the grant, and \$1,980 is the Towns match. The \$1,980 is an in-kind match, which includes the Highway Departments work, and the administrations work associated with fulfilling the requirements of the grant.

RE: Town Manager Update

Fire Department Contracts

Meetings have been held with both Fire Departments to renew our contract by June 30th. The Fire Departments were asked to bring the contracts to both of their departments to discuss it and provide feedback on whether the contract is sufficient. We learned a lot over the past two (2) years working under the contract the Town has with the Fire Departments, and the contract was modified to accommodate for this.

Roofing Projects

Materials for the Town Garage roofing project have been delivered, and the project continues to move forward as planned.

Generator Projects

The Martin Memorial Hall Generator project is moving forward on May 31st. We have coordinated with Irving and are awaiting an estimate for that part of the work.

We held a site visit at the Town Garage and 1879 Schoolhouse on May 9th with Brookfield Service. We are waiting to receive estimates for both projects to compare the similarities and differences between generator variations at both sites.

ARPA Update

A second ARPA working group meeting will take place at the 1879 Schoolhouse on Thursday, June 8th at 6:30pm.

Finance Report

A Finance Report will be given at the June 5th Selectboard meeting, capturing revenues and expenses for period 11, and projecting our final month of revenues and expenses.

Grand List Update

We added \$3,000,000 to the Grand List this year from permit work, GMP utility went down by \$990,000, and VELCO went down by \$826,800. The \$50,000 exemption for personal property resulted in a \$250,000 loss when compared to last years PP/Inv. Incomes. A few had increases in their overall total, so the PP/INV nets out at an increase of \$80,000. A comparison from last year's 411 to the one as of today shows an increase of \$1,273,443 in the Tows total listed value. We still need to obtain solar values from the state, which may or may not affect anything. There is the possibility that some PP/INV forms come in late, but it doesn't appear that any will exceed the 50K threshold. Grievances may also change these figures. According to the Lister Calendar from the State of Vermont, the latest abstract should be filed is June 4th. According to the previous Selectboard meeting the board thought it was May 4th, but the confirmed date is June 4th. The abovementioned figures can and do continue to change, and we cannot be sure what the true number will be until after the grievance period ends. We also continue to wait on the final veterans' exemptions from the VA. The filing of the "final" grand list is no later than July 25th. Grievances will take place on June 15th following notifications that are scheduled to be mailed out on May 25th.

1879 Schoolhouse Operations

The 1879 Schoolhouse Committee had remaining tasks to complete, and those tasks have been completed following their meeting on May 8th. The Committee voted to dissolve and adjourn, and the vote was unanimous. The building will be used for rentals, board, commission, and committee meetings, public hearings, after school programming, social service and non-profit meetings, emergency operations center, yoga & meditation classes, and conferences. There will also be joint events where the building will be used during events at Hoisington field. Lastly, the building will continue to be utilized as a food shelf. A maintenance plan has been put into effect. We've developed a rental calendar, a departure checklist for rentals, in addition to an application that requires approval prior to rentals. The gardening club has plans to plant flowers around the building, and we have plans to apply for further grant opportunities to continue to improve the building without using local tax dollars.

Fourth Quarterly Tax Payment Due

The 4th Quarterly Tax payment is due on Wednesday, May 17th by 4:30pm.

There are two transfers into Reserve Funds that we should make:

<u>\$ 808 into the Property Reappraisal Reserve Fund.</u> Each year we receive a state grant to help fund our eventual need for reappraisal. We transfer that grant into our Property Reappraisal Reserve Fund. We do not know the exact amount of the grant until the check is received. We budget \$ 15,000 for this grant and we transfer that amount early in the fiscal year. Once the grant is received we then adjust that transfer to match the amount of the grant. The grant this year was in the amount of \$ 15,808 so we need to transfer an additional \$ 808 into the reserve.

<u>\$ 35,640 to the Upper Falls Covered Bridge Restoration Reserve Fund.</u> We received an insurance check in this amount to help pay for repair to the bridge due to a recent vehicular incident. Since the repairs will likely not be completed prior to 6/30/23 when the current fiscal year ends, we should move this amount into the reserve fund so we can carry it forward to cover the eventual repair costs.

The Board would need to pass a motion to authorize these transfers.

RE: Discontinuance of Highway #95

Dear Selectors, residents,

On May 1st the Highway Superintendent presented a request to discontinue Highway #95. *See Attachment A*. Information has been collected and a Notice of Public Hearing assembled. In the case this proposal moves forward, Selectors will examine the site on Thursday, June 15th at 6:30pm, and hold a public hearing on Monday, June 19th at 6:30pm. The Town is hereby notified that changes are being proposed to discontinue Highway #95, which is located off Cooks Pond Road in Weathersfield. The administration is proposing the abovementioned times and dates; however, these dates are dependent on the schedules of each of our Selectors and may change on May 15th during the Selectboard meeting when this is discussed.

The process to do this is as follows:

1) Notice and Hearing

- a. Appoint a Time and Date for examining the premises and hearing the persons interested, and give 30 days' notice to the petitioners, and to persons owning or interested in lands through which the highway may pass or abut, of the time when they will inspect the site and receive testimony.
- b. Notice shall also be given to any municipal planning commission in the Town, post a copy of the notice in the office of the town clerk, and cause a notice to be published in a local newspaper of general circulation in the area not less than 10 days before the time set for the hearing.
- c. The notice shall be given by certified mail sent to the official residence of the person(s) required to be notified.

2) Survey or order of discontinuance

a. After examining the premises and hearing any interested parties, and if the selectboard judges that the public good, necessity, and convenience of the inhabitants of the municipality require the highway to be laid out, altered, or reclassified as claimed in the petition, it shall cause the highway to be surveyed in accordance with the provisions of section 33 of this title if the highway right-of-way cannot be determined and shall place suitable monuments to properly mark the bounds of the survey.

b. If the selectboard decides to discontinue a highway, the discontinuance shall be in writing setting forth a completed description of the highway.

3) Selectboard's return, recording

- a. Within 60 days after the examination and hearing, the selectboard shall return the original petition with a report of its findings and of the manner of notifying the parties together with the survey or discontinuance, to the town clerk's office. The selectboard's order laying out, altering, reclassifying, or discontinuing the highway, with the survey, shall be recorded by the clerk.
- b. As part of the report of findings provided for in subsection (a) of this section, the selectboard may order that the petitioner bear the cost of upgrading a class 4 town highway to the class 3 town highway standards established in subdivision 302(a)(3)(B) of this title. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a town to maintain a class 4 highway or to upgrade a highway from class 4 to class 3.

4) Evidence of highway completion or discontinuance

- a. The lack of a certificate of completion of a highway shall not alone constitute conclusive evidence that a highway is not public.
- b. A town or county highway that has not been kept passable for use by the general public for motorized travel at the expense of the municipality for a period of 30 or more consecutive years following a final determination to discontinue the highway shall be presumed to have been effectively discontinued. This presumption of discontinuance may be rebutted by evidence that manifests a clear intent by the municipality or county and the public to consider or use the way as a highway. The presumption of discontinuance shall not be rebutted by evidence that shows isolated acts of maintenance, unless other evidence exists that shows a clear intent by the municipality or county to consider or use the highway as if it were a public right-of-way.
- c. A person whose sole means of access to a parcel of land or portion thereof owned by that person is by way of a town highway or unidentified corridor that is subsequently discontinued shall retain a private right-of-way over the former town highway or unidentified corridor for any necessary access to the parcel of land or portion thereof and maintenance of his or her right-of-way.

I have researched TH #95 as per your request for information.

Currently TH #95 is listed as a class 4 town highway .25 miles in length on the 2019 highway milage map. It is also marked with a U on the map to represent it is impassable/ or untraveled according to the map key.

I have done a site visit and found the road to be unidentifiable from the surrounding fields. I have found no trace of a possible road other than a gap in a stone wall that may represent a lane.

This road starts at its intersection with Cooks Pond Road and proceeds east for .25 miles over parcel span # 705-224-10852 (Keniston). It doesn't connect to a neighboring parcel or appear to be a right of way to any other parcel. The road in its entirety is on the Keniston parcel.

Currently this property is a working farm, and the location of the road is agricultural fields. Mr Keniston has stated that map companies have tried to send vehicles onto his property to get to Divoll Pasture Road. Also, according to Mr Keniston, this road is not mentioned in the deed to his property.

As a class 4 highway per act 64 I am required to inspect it annually. I am also required to repair any erosion if present (in this case no road is present).

To resolve the above-mentioned issues, I recommend the select board discontinue Town Highway #95 as per Vermont Statues Tittle 19 Chapter 7.

This will resolve the issues that Mr. Keniston has with a Town Highway passing onto his property. At the same time also relieves the Town of Weathersfield from the cost of its maintence if needed in the future.

The property in question is parcel # 09-01-45.001 and belongs to my wife and myself (John & Bonnie Keniston).



REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN OF WEATHERSFIELD, VERMONT, OP PROCEEDINGS TO CHANGE THE ORDER OF AN OPEN PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN WEATHERSFIELD, VERMONT, TO THAT OF A TRAIL.

On the 2nd day of February, A.D. 1962 we, the undersigned, Selected of the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, a Municipal Corporation, in Windsor County, in the State of Vermont, prepared a notice in writing of a proposed change in the order of an open public highway in Weathersfield, Vermont, to that of a trail in accordance with Title 19 Vermont Statutes Annobated, Sec.

In said notice it was stated that we would meet in the Town Office in Perkinsville, in the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, on the 20th day of February, AD 1962, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, for the purpose of examinis the premises, hearing parties interested in the proposal of changing the order fo said highway from that of an open public highway to that of a trail, and of widering claims for damages. widering claims for damages.

A copy of this notice was posted in the town clerk's office in Per-kinsville, in the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, and another copy was Posted in the Marston Store building in Ascutney, in the Town of Weathersfield, Ver-mont, two public places within the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont.

A copy of the same notice was mailed by certified mail to:

Harry J. and Frances Morrisett, RD #2, Springfield, Vermont Everett W. and Grace Stevens, RD #2, Springfield, Vermont Richard and John Jones, West Claremont, New Hampshire,

they being the owners of the land abutting the portion of said highway to be altered from an open public highway to a trail. The notice was also recorded in the highway records in the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, as required by law.

On the 20th day of February, AD 1962, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, we met at the Town Office in Perkinsville, in the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, for the purpose of examining the premises, hearing parties interested and considering claims for damages.

After our examination of the premises, and discussing same with those appearing at the hearing, mamely: Harry J. Morrisett and Everett W. Stevens, it was pointed out that Everett Stevens now owned the land formerly belonging to Richard and John Jones and that Stevens and Morrisett wish the road discontinued rather than put into a trail.


