No comments from Select Board Members

Brandon Gulnick, Town Manager spoke with Flo Ann Dango regarding Town Meeting, if it was going to be virtual or in person.

WEATHERSFIELD WEBSITE

The final design has been submitted to CIVIC CMS and approval has been granted. We are waiting for the developers to do the necessary work to make the changes live. Once they are live, I will notify the public.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The Highway Department has attached the wing on the Grader, all plow fronts and sanders are attached to the trucks, maintenance has been completed to the trucks, plows, and wings, and the Highway Crew has hauled over 4,000 yards of sand. Highway has already been out a couple of times sanding and are well prepared for the winter ahead.

MARTIN MEMORIAL HALL REPAIRS

The Martin Memorial Hall Board of Trustees held a meeting on December 1st at 5pm to discuss downstairs of Martin Memorial Hall and the work that has been completed to date. We developed a scope of work, which includes removal of the existing carpet and replace with wainscoting. Wainscoting will be on the bottom half all around the room and the wallpaper will be removed and the top half will be painted a neutral color. The remaining old baseboard heating covers will be replaced to match what was installed. The ceiling will be repaired in the problem area & electrical wiring will be covered. The RFP will also include replacing drywall, installing plywood, and replacing baseboards in the exposed areas. The RFP will be advertised on 12/7/21, bids will be due on 1/6/22, and a public bid opening will take place on 1/7/22. The MMH Board of Trustees will meet on 1/10/22 at noon to vote on the awarded contractor. The RFP will require the work to begin no later than January 17th, 2022, with a completion date no later than February 18th, 2022.

VOREC GRANT

Over the past several we have been working with the Chamber of Commerce, ATA, Ludlow, and Chester on a joint application to obtain a grant through the VOREC Program. The first step was to submit a letter of intent. Our project was accepted, and we were invited to submit a full application. The application was submitted on November 29th. The Scope of work is as follows:

1. Building of the 1.7 mile "high line" single track trail, which will also double as an access point from the State Park to the beginner trails as well as the eventual "trail around Mt. Ascutney."
2. The design and development of approximately 3 miles of intermediate single-track trail in the area designated as the "blue zone."
3. The replacement of a bridge which crosses a seasonal stream with a new bridge or culvert. This crossing is an integral connector to the overall networks and is on the existing double track re-opened by the ATA in the past year.
4. The destruction and disposal of metal roofing materials from a 1960s log hunting camp on the property which is no longer safe and a public hazard.

I will update the Town once we receive a decision on whether the Department of Forests, Parks, and Recreation funds our proposal. See the attached Letter of Support.

MEMORANDUM

Re: 2023 General Fund Budget

REVENUES

Overall, revenue is decreasing by \$37,257. The admin budget is responsible for \$47,923 of this decrease in revenue. This is primarily due to the appropriation revenue that was voted on by the board, but we did not put it on the ballot. In the final moment of the budget process, it was removed as an expenditure transfer to reserves, however, it was not removed as a revenue.

There is a new revenue in finance for \$22,943. This is revenue generated from Windsor because we share an accountant with them 70%/30%. Their share of the total cost of the accountants cost of employment is 30% OR \$22,943 in FY23.

The Town Clerk anticipates an \$8,435 increase in revenues, which are generated from land records revenue, and computerization revenues.

There is a \$16,662 decrease in revenue from the Fire Departments. This is due to the Town assuming the total responsibility of finance for both Fire Departments. In FY22 we decreased fundraising at AVFA, and in FY23 we're seeking to back it out completely.

FUND BALANCE

We estimate a \$79,917 cumulative fund balance in the General Fund. This is pending confirmation from the auditors. The auditors requested to push the draft audit presentation back to January 3rd (first selectboard meeting of 2022). In addition to this, there's a \$69,400 allowance for doubtful accounts that will be closed and transferred into fund balance.

As a reminder, we used \$35,973 in fund balance in FY22 to reduce the tax need for the General Fund. In the FY23 Budget proposal I have included the use of \$45,418 to offset the loss of revenue in the General Fund and to keep the tax need increase down to a penny OR 33K. This can be modified how the board deems appropriate. If we move forward with this plan, there will still be an estimated \$34,499 and \$69,400 to discuss OR \$103,899.

GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES OVERVIEW

Overall, expenditures in the General Fund are increasing by 0.36% OR \$5,188. In the case all special appropriations pass for non-profit requests over \$500, the total increase will be \$23,221 OR 1.5%. There are increases and decreases within each departments budget that contributed to the balance. See descriptions in the following pages.

ADMIN EXPENDITURES

Overall, Administration expenses are decreasing by 1% OR (\$2,927). As noted above, this will change in the case all special appropriations pass for non-profit requests over \$500. Personnel expenses increased by 6% overall. Office expenses increased by \$3,770, utilities increased by \$1,596, legal fees decreased by \$1,000, Martin Memorial Hall expenses decreased due to a change in custodians & removal of payments to Highway for services.

FINANCE EXPENDITURES

The Finance budget is increasing by \$39,107 overall, however, \$22,943 of this increase is reimbursed from Windsor for accounting services. The total increase with the revenue offset included is \$16,164.

LISTERS EXPENDITURES

The Listers budget is decreasing by \$7,052 during the first year of our transition to NEMRC. NEMRC Assessor Nate Stoddard is budgeted for \$24,000, however this amount might be less than what we budgeted. We will not know until they complete 1 year. So far in FY22 we have expended less than \$5,000 on NEMRC services. A line item for our Listers has been secured at \$10,379, which allots up to 600 hours for Lister work in Town.

LAND USE EXPENDITURES

The Land Use budget is decreasing by \$13,379 overall. This is due to personnel changes from hourly to salary. There were issues over the past year with Land Use maps exceeding the amount that was budgeted. This was adjusted by \$900 to allow for these expenses.

POLICE EXPENDITURES

Overall, the Police Department budget is increasing by \$10,705. These increases are primarily due to a \$6,185 increase in workers compensation and an increase in the price of fuel for our Police cars.

TOWN CLERK EXPENDITURES

The Town Clerk budget is increasing by \$18,962 overall. Marion Ballam has been hired as the Deputy Clerk. This decision along with the 3% increase in wages accounts for \$14,895 out of the \$18,962 increase. The remaining increases are vault and computerization expenses, which are offset in revenue generated for these purposes.

LIBRARY EXPENDITURES

Personnel expenses in the library department is increasing by 2.5%, whereas wages have been increased by the COLA of 3%. Administrative expenses are being increased by \$3,169, which is primarily due to the inclusion of IT services and additional trustees' expenses providing flexibility with performance evaluations.

ASCUTNEY FIRE ASSOCIATION EXPENDITURES

Ascutney Fire Associations budget is decreasing by \$2,471, however, the tax need for this department is increasing by \$14,191. As noted above, this is due to the Town assuming all financial responsibility for the fire departments and the removal of fundraising efforts.

WEST WEATHERSFIELD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT EXPENDITURES

West Weathersfield Volunteer Fire Departments budget is increasing by \$8,925. This includes a \$1,497 increase in communications, \$1,500 in vehicle maintenance, \$1,150 in hose testing, \$1,300 in utilities, \$423 in personnel, and \$2,600 in office expenses.

GENERAL FIRE SERVICES EXPENDITURES

The General Fire Services budget is decreasing by \$48,445 because the WWVFD 2017 Spartan Fire Truck is paid off. If the Town votes to purchase a new Fire Truck for AVFA there will be an added payment in the budget. Depending on the choice of financing & cost of the truck this payment can increase or decrease in FY24.

Dear Selectboard Members:

Chief Spaulding forwarded the following to my office:

The AVFD is looking to replace the town's 1995 pumper with a new 2,500-gallon tanker with the price not to exceed \$390k. The tanker would be a two-person cab, dual axle, foam tank, roll-up doors, pump, speed lays, hose bed for 1,200' of 4-inch supply line. The light bar, siren, and scene lights would come off the old truck. This equipment has been upgraded over the last five years- saving approximately \$15,500 off the price. The town would sell the old truck for \$5,000-8,000.

With the truck being 26 years old at the time of this writing, it will be between 28-29 years old by the time a new one is built. Over the last five years, the town has replaced the front suction at a price of \$6,800, as well as having had pump work done last December. \$5k which was a temporary fix until we town / Fire department decides which way we go, the price to repair the pump correctly was over \$7,100 last December, and the upgraded light bar and scene lights for 13,300. As this truck gets older, parts are getting harder to find. This truck was originally our first run truck and when the 2013 truck arrived, the 1995 slid into the second truck out the door. This truck only carries 1,250 gallons of water, however, the new one would have 2,500 gallons of water, as well as a 30-gallon foam tank- doubling the amount of water on scene.

The town had a report done and one of the things the report stated was that the town did not have enough water on wheels, suggesting the departments/town look at getting tankers to replace the older trucks. Today the fire service- both careers, as well as volunteer departments- are so shorthanded that we are reaching out to departments that are 30-45 minutes out with tankers to assist us. Some of the departments that previously sent two trucks, are now only sending one-man trucks or they have gotten rid of a truck due to a lack of personnel. The town of Weathersfield does not have municipal water systems for fire purposes, so we use dry hydrants, as well as tankers, to truck water to the fire scene. The new tanker would buy the fire fighters a little more time fighting the fire- in addition to AVFD Engine 4 with 1,250 gallons, West Weathersfield Engine 7 with 1,800 gallons, and West Weathersfield Engine 2 with 1,250 gallons- totaling 6,800 gallons. This tanker would be used for the whole town and would also have a pump on it, serving as a backup while other apparatus goes in for maintenance or is unavailable.

History

In the previous Selectboard meeting on 10/04/2021 we presented the following information:

Ascutney Volunteer Fire Associations 1995 Ford Engine 1 will be 27 years old next year. According to the draft Capital Plan this is the next truck on our list to replace. I held a meeting with AVFD Fire Chief Darrin Spaulding to discuss the replacement plan.

Chief Spaulding recommends replacing Engine 1 with a Tanker because an Engine only holds 1200-1500 gallons of water. Considering we do not have municipal water having a Tanker will increase the available water supply at a scene to 4,000 gallons (Engine 4 (1500 gallons) + Tanker (2500 gallons). This provides AVFD with enough water to hold down a structure fire until mutual aid arrives.

West Weathersfield Volunteer Fire Department's truck is paid off this year. The annual payment on this truck was \$45,800. We currently have \$122,854 in our Fire Apparatus Acquisition Reserve. The estimate for the proposed purchase of a new 2,500-gallon tanker is \$360K. If we put \$100K down and finance the remaining \$260K for 5 years the principal payment will be \$52,000, at 7 years the principal payment will be 37,142, and at 10 years the principal payment will be \$26,000.

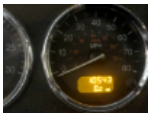

MEMORANDUM

To: Selectboard
From: Town Manager
Date: December 16, 2021
Re: 2023 Highway Fund Budget

REVENUES

Overall, revenue is decreasing by \$5,530 in the Highway Fund. This revenue was generated from the General Fund because the Highway Department billed the 1879 Schoolhouse, Martin Memorial Hall, Proctor Library, and other departments for Highway Services. This practice did not make any sense, so we decided to stop doing this.

We budgeted the same Highway State Aid as FY22; however, we have heard that State Aid is likely to increase. If it does increase, I am unsure in advance how much that will affect us. Once we know this information, I will pass it along to you.

Services to Solid Waste & Highway Services to Solid Waste Admin is increasing by 3%. Since the board voted for a 3% increase in wages, we need to increase these lines by 3% to ensure the Solid Waste Fund is paying the correct amount. These are lines I will need to revisit and potentially adjust in FY24 after discussion with West Windsor & Reading.

FUND BALANCE

There is \$27,236 in fund balance remaining from FY20 that we carried forward in FY21/ FY22. In addition, we expect there to be a \$74,776 fund balance in FY21. If this is correct, the cumulative fund balance to discuss is \$108,023. The auditors are still in the process of completing the FY21 audit and said they will be prepared to present their draft audit on January 3rd. We should wait until January 3rd to make any firm decisions on Fund Balance use.

There are various ways we can use the Fund Balance. Keep in mind we're fairly certain there will be another fund balance in FY22 and another in FY23 if State Aid to Highway comes in higher than budgeted. In the budget document presented I'm proposing to use \$76,726 of the \$108,023 to reduce the tax need for this department by \$16,429 for 2 years & \$43,868 to offset the increases in the Highway Budget in FY23. The \$16,429 / 2 years OR \$32,858 will be applied to our Grader Lease in FY23 & FY24. The next payment on this will be FY25, and the lease will be paid in full in FY28. This still leaves \$31,297 to discuss. We can either carry it forward, transfer it to reserves, use it as a down payment on the purchase of the next Highway equipment purchase, or reduce the tax need further.

EXPENDITURES

Personnel expenses are increasing by 7.23%. As discussed in the COLA Impact Study, when we increase wages increases occur in retirement, workers compensation, unemployment, and FICA. Wages increased by 3%, so the overall increase in personnel is 7.23%.

Office expenses are increasing by \$182 overall. Legal expenses have been reduced by \$50, Covered Bridge Insurance has been reduced by \$500, Liability/Vehicle/Boiler/General Insurance is increasing by \$375, Uniforms & Cleaning is increasing by \$1,077, and Office Supplies/ Highway Advertising is decreasing by \$199.

Utilities are increasing by \$3,850. Electricity was reduced by \$205 because the actual came in at \$3,034 in FY21. Similarly, telephone service was budgeted for \$1,942 in FY21, however, the actual came in at \$1,404, so this line was reduced by \$485. The Highway Department proposed and the Selectboard voted in the affirmative for Digital radios. The annual cost of this service is \$5,040.

Highway Garage & Truck expenses are decreasing by \$4,690. We budgeted an additional \$5,000 for diesel fuel or 9%. The actual in FY21 was \$44,273. The cost of fuel is rising and in my opinion there's no stability in Washington, DC. The cost of fuel between July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023, is an educated guess at best.

The equipment, maintenance, repairs, and supplies line is being reduced by \$5,190. When the Highway Digital Radios were proposed this line was to be reduced by the amount of the annual contract for the radios.

The equipment line is being removed. The safety equipment line is being reduced by \$2,000 considering we have only spent \$1,000 in FY21 & we receive grants from PACIF for safety equipment.

Overall, road material and repairs are being reduced by \$4,699. In FY21 we expended \$35,440 in chloride, so this line has been reduced from \$40,000 to \$37,500. Match for grant expenses has been reduced to \$0 because PACIF is doing 100% grants in FY23 rather than the historical 50/50.

Debt service is increasing by \$13,674. This may change depending on what the Selectboard decides to do with the fund balance. As noted above, I am proposing to make a double payment in FY23, which will pay the principal payment for FY23 & FY24.

Fund Balance & Reserves will change once the board decides what to do with the fund balance. This decision is not recommended until the first meeting in January after the auditors present the fund balance.

RESERVE ACCOUNTS

1. Highway Equipment Acquisition: \$154,283.51
2. Highway Capital Maintenance & Improvements: \$186,164.09

Note: Although the reserve account has a balance of \$186,164.09, the Selectboard voted to use \$86,371 from this reserve to pave Kendricks Corner Road. The contract amount for this project is \$136,371. The other \$50,000 is coming from the FY22 budgeted paving line-item.

Unrestricted Balance: \$99,793.09

SPECIAL ARTICLES

1. Replacement of the F550 Plow Truck

The Highway Department is proposing to replace the class 4/5 2012 F-550 4x4 19,300 lb. GVW truck with electric over hydraulic 9' drop side dump body, 9' fisher plow and three-yard, single drive inserts stainless steel sander with a new class 4/5 22,500lb GVW rated 4x4 truck with live hydraulics, 9' stainless steel body, dual drive stainless steel tail gate sander with pre-wetting system, front full trip reversing frame plow, and side mounted wing.

The estimated cost of this proposal is \$59,900 for the Body, Sander, Plow, and Wing, and \$60,162 for the Chassis. See Attachment A - 2023 Truck Proposal and respective attachments.

2. Establish a Reserve Account for the Reclamation of the Bow Pit

There is an act 250 permit for the Bow Pit for its use, which dictates that after each phase of operation we need to put the subsoil and topsoil back down and reseed it. We need to establish a reserve account for bow pit reclamation because we budget \$2,500 annually to save for the reclamation of the bow pit, however, since we did not have a reserve account to transfer these funds into, the \$2,500 has been absorbed into the total highway fund balance. This practice has taken place for a long time. To change this, establishing a reserve account for the purpose of reclaiming the bow pit is required.

Town of Weathersfield Plow Truck Proposal

Purpose:

Replace the class 4/5 2012 F-550 4x4 19,300 lb. GVW truck with electric over hydraulic 9' drop side dump body, 9' fisher plow and three-yard, single drive inserts stainless steel sander.

Proposed replacement:

New class 4/5 22,500 lb. minimum GVW rated 4x4 truck with live hydraulics, 9' stainless steel body, dual drive stainless steel tail gate sander with pre-wetting system, front full trip reversing frame plow, and side mounted wing

Goal:

To increase our efficiencies while plowing and performing other road maintenance task, reduce the amount of salt used by being able to control the material feed and lane width independently, pre wet the salt resulting in a 20-30% reduction in salt used per application, and improve our ability to respond to winter maintenance issues such as plow truck break downs/ slide offs, or employee shortages.

2012 class 4/5 Truck:

- Ford F-550 4x4 Super Duty with 6.7 L Power Stroke diesel engine at 88,300 miles with a GVW of 19,300 lbs., and automatic transmission
- 9' steel dump body with electric over hydraulic hoist, fold down sides, manual tailgate release
- Fisher 9' plow with mold board trip
- After market Hi-way super "P" "single drive 3 yard stainless steel insert style sander

2023 proposed Truck:

- Class 4/5 22,500 LB. minimum GVW 4x4 truck, diesel engine, and automatic transmission
- 9' stainless steel body with live hydraulic lift hoist, manual tailgate, fold down sides
- 10' heavy duty plow with full plow trip, side mounted wing
- Rear dual drive sander with spinner (allows for the adjustment of material and lane width independently of each other)

Other improvements include:

- Stainless steel body
- Live hydraulic dump body (allows the body to lift faster allowing the option of using the truck to spread materials on roads when necessary)
- Increase GVW by 3,200 lbs. making the truck more durable
- Full trip plow (the 2012 truck has a plow that the cutting edge trips instead of the entire plow. This results in a more sensitive tripping plow that causes greatly reduced speeds and more wear on the truck by "Bouncing" the plow)

The 2012 F-550 truck has been a great addition to our fleet. It has been a productive truck but has some limitations. The proposed truck will eliminate these limitations, improve our efficiencies by reducing its routes plow time by 50% per event, and have the capability to assist in "covering" other trucks routes when needed during emergencies.

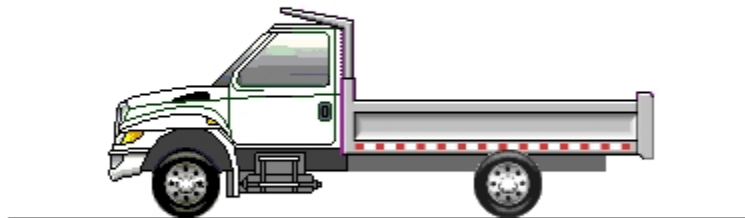

See the attached Conservation Commission Policy. The Conservation Commission has reviewed the policy and they made 1 adjustment to the first section by changing the word “protect” to “conserve.” On 12/06/21 the Selectboard requested clarification on why the Conservation Commission made this change. I reached out to Ryan Gumbart, Conservation Commission chair, who stated the following:

While preserving some of the aspects of the Town's natural, historic, and scenic resources is important; conservation is the primary purpose of the commission. That is to protect their integrity and use them wisely. Preservation seeks to remove the human influence on the resource. Both preservation and conservation are tools for the protection of natural resources. It seems to the commission that to protect and preserve is redundant and misses the point. As the Conservation Commission we felt that it should be clear that conservation of our natural, historic, and scenic resources is our primary objective. Identification is one step towards conservation and preservation has a role to play, but all this can be summarized as protection.

If the board agrees with the policy as written, please move forward with adoption.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION
POLICY AND PROCEDURES

I. PURPOSE AND MISSION

- a. The Conservation Commission is organized pursuant to Title 34, Chapter 118, of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, to identify, conserve, and preserve natural, scenic, and historic resources in the Town of Weathersfield.
- b. The Conservation Commission is charged with developing plans for resource protection and advising Town Officials by directing attention to the Town's natural, Scenic, and Historic resources.
- c. The Conservation Commission administers the Weathersfield Town Forest for the primary purpose of recreation (for the enjoyment of the public and to support economic development), creation and protection of various wildlife and plant habitats, and the education of the public on forest management.

II. ORGANIZATION

- a. According to 24 VSA 118 § 4502 the Conservation Commission shall have not less than three nor more than nine members. All members shall be residents of the municipality.
- b. Members of the conservation commission shall be appointed, and any vacancy filled, by the legislative body of the municipality. The term of each member shall be for four years, except for those first appointed, whose terms shall be varied in length so that in the future the number whose terms expire in each successive year shall be minimized.
- c. The Commission, at the first meeting after annual appointments, shall conduct a reorganization meeting, electing a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Clerk.

III. MEETINGS

- a. The Commission shall comply with all provisions of Vermont's Open Meeting Law.
- b. At its reorganization meeting, the Commission shall establish a regular meeting day, time, and location, which must be posted on the Town of Weathersfield's website.
- c. The Commission shall publish an agenda in accordance with the statutes.
- d. The Commission shall keep written minutes of all the meetings. Minutes of the meetings will be approved at the following meeting, signed by the Chairperson, and submitted to the Town Clerk for recording.

IV. REPORTS

- a. The Commission shall report to the Selectboard at the first Board meeting of each quarter.
- b. The Commission shall submit an annual report for publication in the Town Report.

V. FINANCES

- a. The Town Accountant shall handle all funds received and expended by the Commission as authorized by a warrant issued by the Selectboard.
- b. The Commission may request an update on the commission budget from the Town Accountant at any time.
- c. The Commission may vote to recommend expending funds:
 - i. The meeting minutes will state the motion for expenditure (which shall include the purpose), that the motion carried, and who is to receive the monies.
 - ii. The Commission will submit a written request for expenditures to the Town Manager, with invoices and/or receipts attached as appropriate, using the standard form developed by the Town.
 - iii. The request will either be approved or denied by the Town Manager.
 - iv. If the request is denied, the Commission may appeal to the Selectboard, who may affirm or overturn the Town Manager's decision.
- d. The Commission shall prepare, in November annually, a budgetary request for the following fiscal year. This request shall be submitted to the Town Manager for consideration in the annual budgetary preparation.

VI. INCONSISTENT POLICIES REPEALED

This policy shall amend and replace any provisions of any policy of the Town of Weathersfield in effect at the time of enactment of this amended policy governing any activity included in this amended Policy.

VII. SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Policy, or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Policy or any part thereof.

The Selectboard hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared unconstitutional or ineffective.

VIII. EFFECT

No section of this Policy shall be construed to supersede or replace any Vermont statute.

This amended Policy shall be entered in the minutes of the Selectboard's meeting it was amended at.

The foregoing amended Policy is hereby adopted by the Selectors of the Town of Weathersfield, Vermont, this sixth day of December 2021, and is effective as of this date until amended or repealed.
